Double whammy

PURO VIK, CHILE ↑

Following the triumphant Chilean debut of Vik Chile, Alex and Carrie Vik have opened a second hotel down the hill. Architect Marcelo Daglio has inserted 19 Miesian casas into the tree line, orienting the glass walls and al fresco bathtubs outward towards greenery and 180-degree views of the Millahué Valley and the Andes beyond. Each casa is tastefully tied to a specific aesthetic, and anchored by quiet

visual references, such as a Mondrian-style rug, shoji screens and futons. Meals are served up the hill at Vik Chile, where chef Rodrigo Acuña Bravo's menu features produce harvested from the 11,000 acre grounds.
